

Trees of Life

Trees are the lungs of our planet, inhaling carbon dioxide and exhaling life-giving oxygen. A single oak tree provides a year's supply of oxygen for eight people.

The Bourne Conservation Trust's 200 acres of open space protects a

that supports many areas of human life. Trees provide food, shelter, paper, rubber, plastics and medicinal products. Nine-tenths of the fuel in developing countries comes from trees. Willow trees are the source for the chemical in aspirin. The

chincona tree produces quinine. Recently, the Pacific yew tree, once considered a weed tree, has been found to contain a chemical, taxol, that is an adversary to ovarian and other cancers.

But anyone walking a BCT trail is more likely to think of trees in more personal terms. Trees give us the cooling shade we seek on a summer afternoon. Their leaves whisper to us with surprising intimacy. The fall cycle of spectacular color and inevitable shedding is an annual, poignant reminder of mortality and rebirth that inspires mystics and poets. Gerard Manley Hopkins's poem, *Spring and Fall*, expresses the central question of human existence in the line, "Margaret, are you

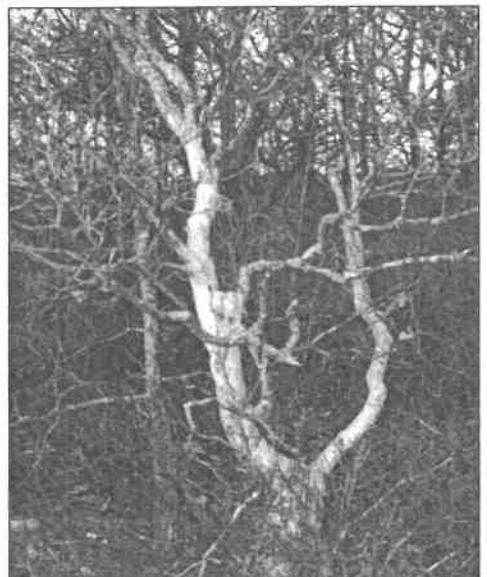
precious assembly of these life-supporting marvels. Most of the local trees are pine, oak and cedar but there are also numerous holly, sassafras, birch and maples as well.

Native Americans in this area depended on trees for shelter, fuel and tools, and European settlers developed a successful economy around management of lumber for shipbuilding and production of turpentine.

These immovable and self-sustaining neighbors are a vital force

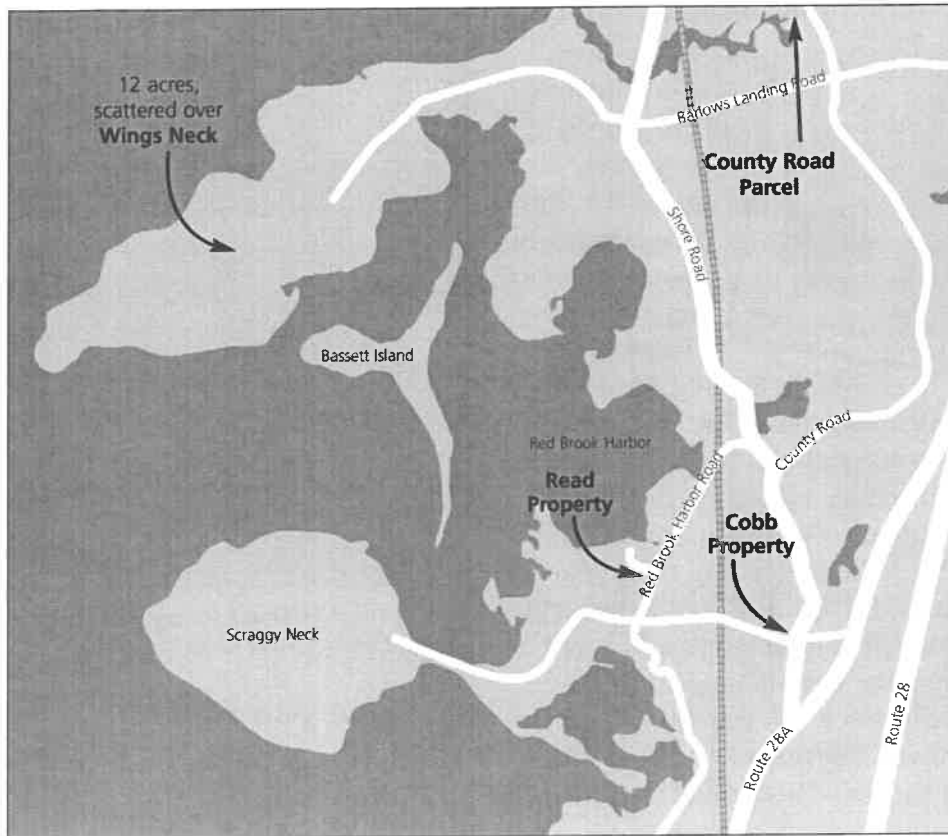
grieving over golden-grove unleaving..." And John Muir's advice, "Every root is an anchor..." allowing us to rest and become "sufficiently calm to feel the joy of living," could be the BCT mission statement.

Recent Acquisitions

The Bourne Conservation Trust happily announces the acquisition of several new parcels of land. Trails on some of these holdings provide access or links to other conservation areas. Other pieces have no trails



but are vital wildlife habitats and preserve both valuable vistas and local rural character for future generations.

In the fall of 2005 a gift from the Wings Neck Conservation Foundation added twelve acres of forested habitat to BCT holdings. Scattered over **Wings Neck**, these pieces will ensure that a portion of the Neck's beautiful woodlands, including Pink Lady slipper sites, will remain undisturbed. Heartfelt thanks are due to Nick and Joanie Baker's diligent efforts in accumulating the Wings Neck properties.

Thanks are also due to Mary Susan Cobb for her generous

donation in December 2005 of half an acre at the intersection of County Road and Scraggy Neck Road. The large trees and bucolic stream on this gem will forever welcome residents and visitors at a major Cataumet "entrance." (*We regret that Sue passed away shortly after donating this land. She is*

corner of Red Brook Harbor Road and Scotch House Cove Road, this 2.3 acres of inviting, mixed hardwood/softwood piece is across the street from the Kingman/Robinson Conservation Area. Purchase of the property for \$200,000 over the next four years will preserve another valuable piece of our rural landscape.

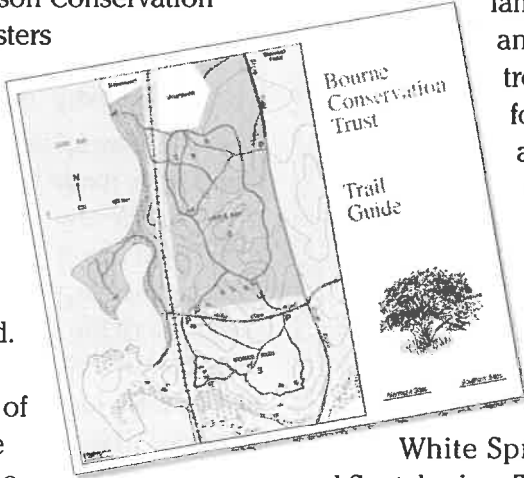

from the sale of these trees have been and will continue to be donated to the BCT.

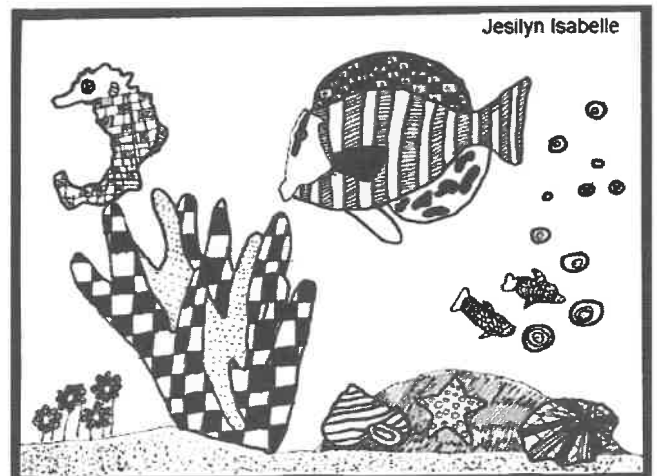
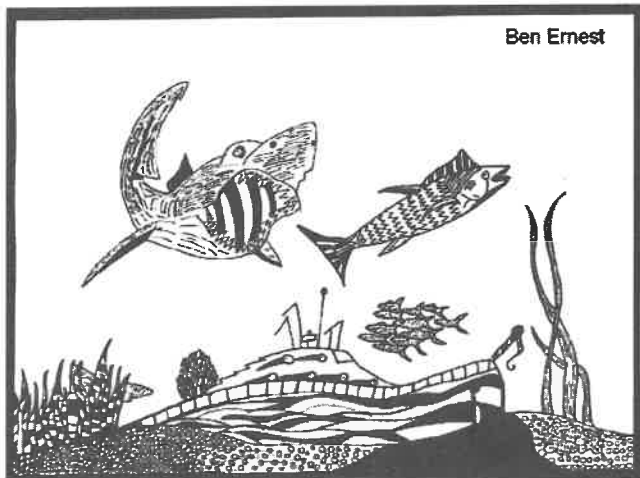
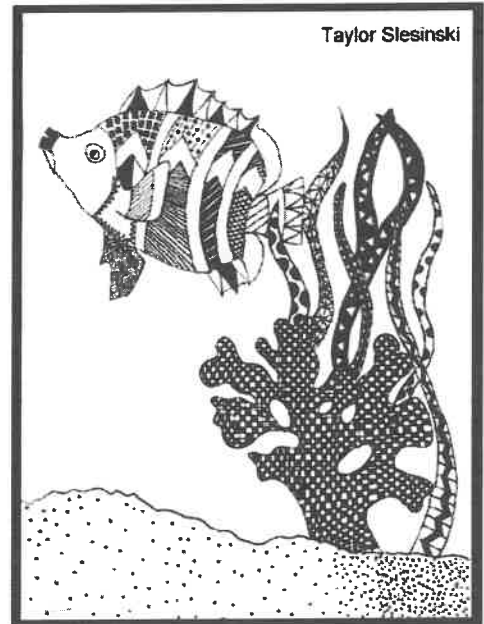
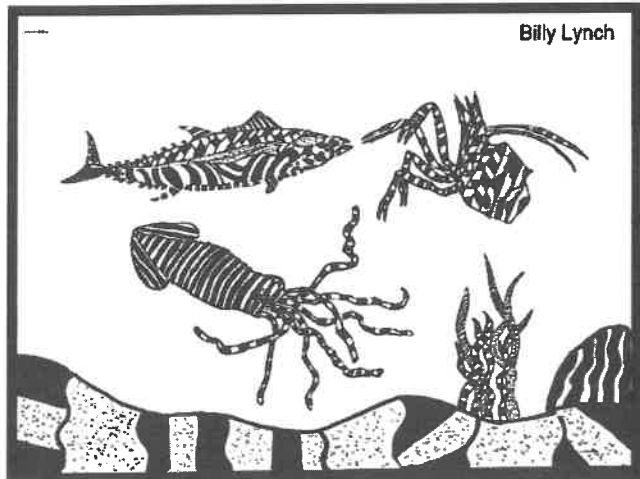
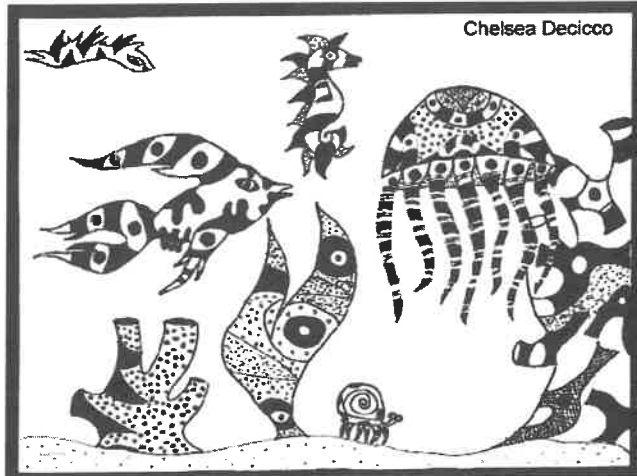
On the road again
