

# We know what it was like to be BOURNE YESTERDAY . . . . What will it be like to be BOURNE TOMORROW?

"You may buy land as cheap as stinking mackerel." Shakespeare wrote that in 1598, and six short years later another Englishman, Bartholomew Gosnold, was working the good ship Concord up Buzzards Bay, just having a look around. Cape Cod's first developer had arrived. If he had been tacking through a time-warp, Gosnold might have heard still another Englishman, Dr. Samuel Johnson, tell him what he'd find beyond Cape Cod's beaches, behind its dunes: "A

place where all sorts of uncooked birds fly about."

Johnson was right then, and he'd be right now. The forty hilly, heavily-wooded watershed acres targeted for preservation by the Red Brook Pond Conservation Project\* abound in "uncooked birds"--some year round residents and others just passing through. Ancient paths wind among stands of pine and oak and skirt kettle holes. Foxes, muskrats, raccoons (and someone claims to have spotted a coyote skulking across the ice in the winter dawn) live here among the wild flowers and blueberries. A couple of smart cormorants fly over from the bay everyday to bathe before stuffing themselves with perch, bluegills, or the herring that annually choke the herring run on the pond's southwest shore. And there are hundreds of turtles, including a monstrous snapper with a head the size of a football.



It's a peaceful, natural place to poke around in whether it's the dead of winter, summer, spring or fall.

But when Bartholomew Gosnold was poking around Cape, Red Brook Pond didn't exist. It was formed when the Red Brook was dammed and backed up to flood the shallow valley that stretches to the northeast. Most of the forty wooded acres in question are well back from the road, but the next time you're driving south on the Shore Road and easing around the curves just south of the underpass, sneak a look to your left and you'll get an idea of the terrain and, in the distance, glimpse the wooded area. There's enough open space back there for thirty home sights--antique colonials, raised ranches, expandable capes--which would increase demands on town services and cause yet another jolt in Bourne's school system

--not to mention thirty new septic systems in the watershed.

What happens back there comes down to one of those "either/or" choices. The "or" alternative seems pretty clear. The "either" alternative is the reason the Red Brook Pond Conservation Project needs your help.

(The reason for this somewhat bizarre timetable lies in the fact that we're dealing with three sellers and have three closing dates scheduled.)


## It's A Matter of Degrees
